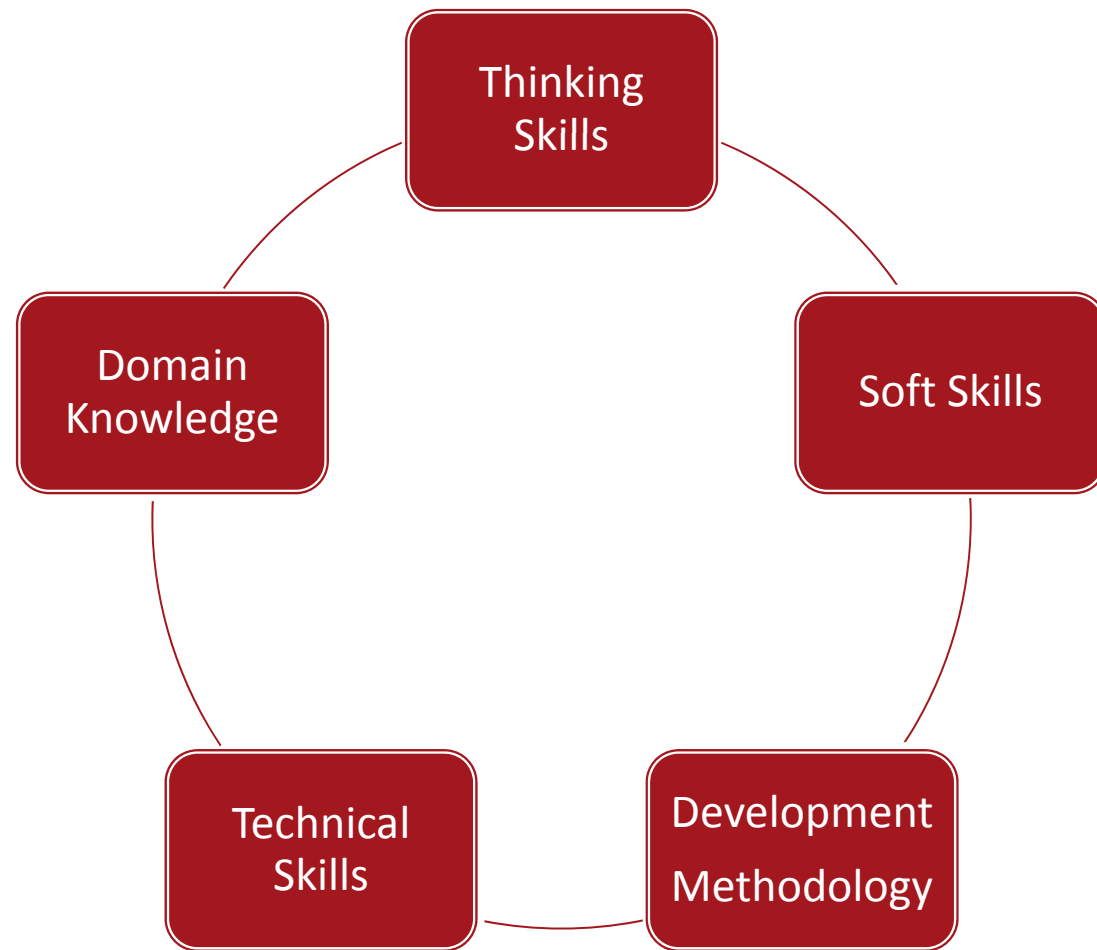

- Listen

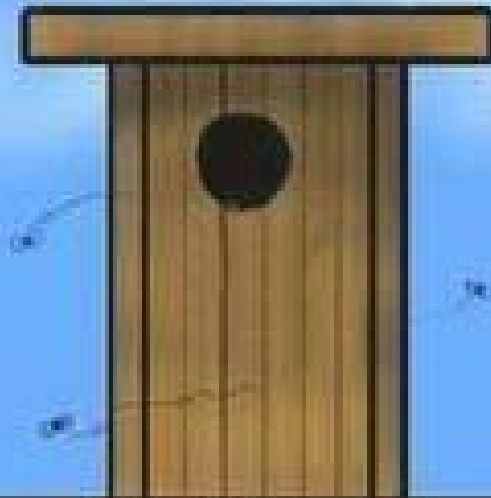
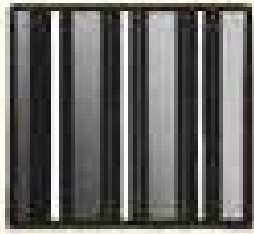


Collaboration means

- Finding solutions

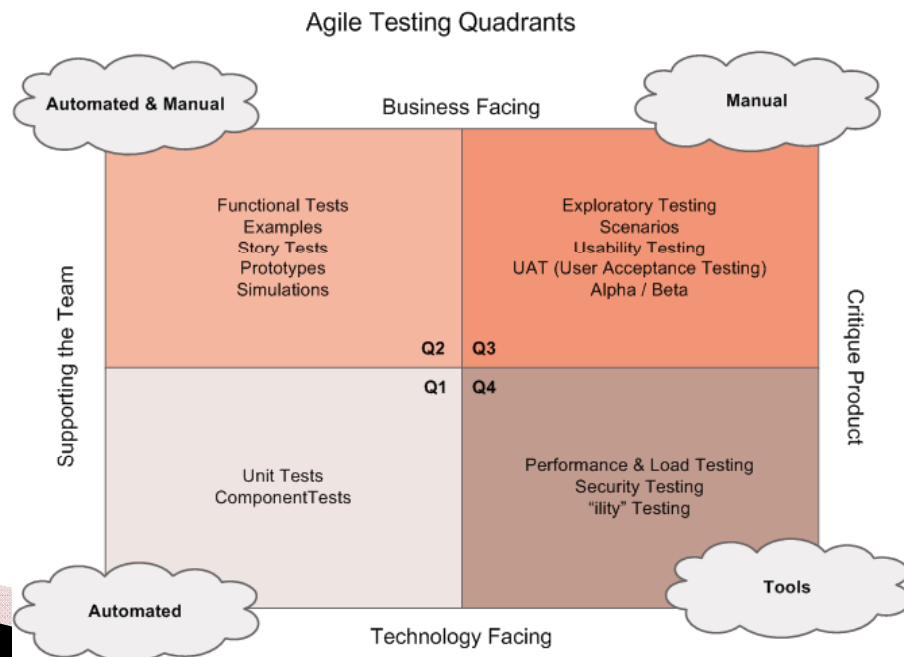
